RSIPF Commissioner visits polling stations in Honiara to reassure public of security

"My intention of the visit to the various polling stations is to reassure people of Honiara and the rest of the country that the security is under control and that they should not have any fear while casting their votes. A voter, Mr Arnold Ledi who was casting his vote at White River Polling Station when Commissioner visited says, "I am happy to cast my ballot paper today at a very safe and secure polling station. It is so good to see Police and Correctional officers out here to ensure that we cast our votes in a safe and secure environment. Today is much better than previous polling days."

Commissioner Varley visited polling stations at Henderson, Panatina School, Marine School, Honiara High School, Mbokonavera School, Bishop Epalle, and the White River Polling Station.
