RSIPF women's take part in international women's day in Honiara

More than 100 plus Women Officers of the Royal Solomon Islands Police Force (RSIPF) took part in the march alongside other women in Honiara to mark International Women's Day, today, 08 March 2023.

Chief of Staff (CoS), to the Commissioner of Police and Chair Lady for the RSIPF women Advisory Network, Ms Laisalyn Mua highlighted that the police is committed to the gender equity and progress of women in the police force.

Speaking to RSIPF women at Rove Police Headquarters the Chair lady of RSIPF Women's encourages women in policing to be role models not only to other women's and girls' but to the community that we are serving.
