New Zealand Police, under Solomon Island Police Support Program (SIPSP) advisors, alongside the Provincial Training Officer (PTO), Sergeant Audrey Suhata delivered the Training.

The training was positive and well-received, with staff saying they appreciated learning about the decision making tool the 'self-test' which teaches values and ethical behaviours when police make decisions within the community.
